Bangalore Region had its first **Region Assembly** in two groups. 25 of our sisters had gathered in Maria Sadan from 2 - 4 May and 20 sisters from 7 - 9 May. Fr. P.D. Mathew S.J. (Supreme Court Lawyer) was our resource person. The first day was dedicated to reflect on our Vision and Mission, stressing the importance of having the **vision of Jesus**, looking through the eyes of Jesus. If our vision is self oriented,



our mission will also be self oriented, in which case, there is the danger of the Congregation of Jesus (CJ) collapsing into Congregation of Judas (CJ). Mary Ward had the vision/spirit of Jesus. **Divine Love** was the driving force that helped her to labour strenuously for the Glory of God. Fr.

PD Mathew exhorted us to be rooted in the Love of Jesus, be united in Love and march ahead in Love, to the future to fulfil our mission of love.

The next two days were spent in reflecting on **Human Rights**, in general and very specially in **Education**. He stressed the importance of knowing our rights so that we can give life to the lifeless and bring justice to the marginalized. During the three days we had very meaningful Eucharistic Celebration based on our mission and the spirit and life of Mary Ward.

Seminar on Discernment of Spirits & Prayer

A Foundations of Discernment of Spirits:

- 1. Why some people have wrong idea of God?
- 2. God has a plan for me. (Gen 12:1)
- 3. God speaks to me in my heart. (Deut 30:11-14)
- 4. Satan too speaks to me. (Mk 1:12)

B Spiritual Feelings:

(i) Consolation (ii) Desolation

The forces of **Good Spirit** and **Evil Spirit** continually influence our heart. Human heart is a battle ground. **Good Spirit** is God himself - good angel and good desires. **Evil Spirit** is Satan, - my selfishness, the influence of the sinful world.

C Three Degrees of Consolation

First: Experience of spiritual tears when one is touched by God's goodness, touched by the passion of Jesus or one's own sinfulness.

Second: Experience of increased faith, hope and charity.

Third: Experience of deep peace and joy which attracts one to heavenly things. Consolation goes deeper as we progress in prayer life.
