

School Activities

The school campus was vibrant and full of life as we began various co-curricular activities such as dance, keyboard, chess, karate, Zumba, and more. These activities provide our students with opportunities for

creativity, discipline, and skill-building, thereby contributing to their all-round development. The KG Section Kids Fest began with a variety of delightful programmes, as teachers and parents took great initiative in preparing the little ones for performances such as dance and action songs. The event gave our youngest students an opportunity to overcome stage fear and gain confidence in public

speaking. All winners were honoured with prizes, and it was heartening to see enthusiastic participation from a good number of children.

The Primary Section organised a Kids Fest featuring a variety of



programmes such as cinematic dance, elocution, recitation, and folk dance. The event was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Anthony Ponuur, the Parish Priest, who emphasised the significance of cultural activities in fostering the all-round development of students.



The Secondary Section organised their annual cultural fest, SPANDAN, which featured a diverse array of student performances and competitions over two days. Guidance and Growth Sessions: With the implementation of NEP 2020, the textbooks and Assessment Pattern for Std. I have been revised. 



Bangalore, and Rev.


