

THEMES: GENDER EQUALITY & WATER CONSERVATION

Mary Ward JPIC South Asia General Meet (virtual) with 45 schools of CJ and Loreto schools, was held on 15th January to 17th January 2021. At the conclusion of the General Meet, it was decided that the Mary Ward Schools (i.e., all CJ and Loreto schools of South Asia) would adopt the following goals and meet their objectives by September 2024.

GOALS TO BE ACHIEVED

1.Gender and Water Audit through survey conducted by the students and the staff of all institutions.

Five of our students from class 9 actively took part in it. We will be conducting the Water audit when the school reopens.

2. Adopt the green campus program in all institutions and contribute to the SDG.

Green Campus Programme is a Climate Reality project of Government of India. It's a platform where schools and colleges are motivated to improve the sustainability factor and green practices. It also imparts climate change education to teachers and students.

The objective is to achieve the recognition from Climate reality India under Green Campus program and get certified as a green school.

Our school has already registered and has started the process has registered for the Green Campus Programme Certificate. The teachers' committee is formed to carry out this Programme. We had the first round of meetings with the management of Green Campus Project group Delhi.

Mary Week celebration in the School

The month of January is special to all the Mary Ward Schools as we celebrate her Birth and Death anniversary to recognize and emulate her invaluable contribution to the lives of many. This year Mary Ward week was celebrated virtually. Unlike previous years, this year it was live telecasted on you tube. There was a meaningful prayer service organized by class 6 & 7. A variety of Programmes such as songs and poems on Mary Ward's life and vision, Quality launch (based on the qualities of Mary Ward), Mono act, Dance drama depicting different stages of Mary Ward etc. were conducted.

The girl-led Conversation Circles brought girls together to have productive dialogue about the issues in the Generation Equality Action Coalitions, their impact on girls' lives and to develop methods for collaborative advocacy within their communities and globally. The speakers of this occasion were Mr. Tushar Himatsinghka on 'A Zero Waste Warrior-To be or not to be One ', Sr. Monica Suchiang IBVM on 'US Earthlings as seekers of Truth and Doers of Justice', Mrs. Elsie Gabriel on 'Living waters, Flow on' and Fr. Pedro Walpole SJ on 'Nature and Nurture – Two sides of same coin'. This session was so enriching that it could bring better mankind. Those personalities enlightened and motivated the youth to change and bring change. It also made us to think about our own contributions to the really needy people in our society.

On 24th May 2020 Laudato Sisters conducted a Firm Ground by Sr. Pabina Rudum IBVM. The main points taught by her were 'Never to give up when you are trying to reach a goal; Pollution enters the climate and thereby creates climate change; Water is

being wasted, which should not happen; If you see Injustice you should help'. The students attended the sessions and sent their feedback.

On 24th June 2020 on Un75 a Zoom meeting was conducted by JPIC on basis of Covid -19 pandemic. The participants were asked to be ready with answers for three questions given by the coordinators. They were given 1 minute to answer. A Preparatory session was held on the previous day to clear the queries and to arrange the meeting.

The JPIC team organized WORLD FOREST DAY week celebration from 14th July-20th July 2020. A class was conducted by Fr. John Rogers SJ on 'Back to Green in LTS 'in which he gave guidelines to promote tree plantation and to make our city Greener. On Friday 24th July 2020 a Zoom meeting was held on 'Committed to the cause working on Frontline to end Human Trafficking' at 3 P.M.

UNICEF along with NINEISMINE has released an online course on Climate Change consisting of simple Multiple-Choice Questions, an assignment and an advocacy-based task. On completion of the course the participant received certificates from Greta Thunberg 's Friday for Future, UNICEF and NINEISMINE. Students of classes 8-12 were encouraged to do this course.

On Thursday August 12, 2020, at 4:30 P.M. the IBVM /CJ UN NGO Office in collaboration with Tarumithra conducted a webinar to celebrate International Youth Day 2020. The Theme was "Youth Engagement for Global Action" to highlight the ways in which youth engage at local, national, and Global levels is enriching national and multilateral Institutions. The Speakers of this program were Janet Palafox IBVM and Cynthia Mathew CJ who are NGO Representatives of the UN. They shared their experience and perspective on how youth are engaged in global justice.

On September 8, 2020 at 11.00 A.M. a session was conducted an E-Launch of the UN handbooks for schools. Teachers and students from various parts of the world attended

the session. On September 22nd, the JPIC team from Nirmala Public School, Pizhaku distributed lunch packets at Kunjachan Missionary Bhavan, Ramapuram in terms of Charity.

On January 2021 the JPIC organized National General Meet of JPIC. The animators were to send the no. of sections and no. of students of classes 4&5, 6&7, 8&9 and 11.
