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• • Ever since the Pandemic started all of us are going through challenging times. We have taken on the challenge and arranged for virtual classes to take care of the teaching- learning transactions in our school.

Teachers have been trained for several days how to take virtual classes either by on-line classes in Zoom App or by preparing videos and posting them in Telegram App. They are also trained how to correct students' answer scripts by using WhatsApp and Google Form. So now our teachers are competent enough to conduct Teaching- Learning process, Examinations and Evaluations using new technology. After the Evaluation **E- Report** was sent to every student. The parents are happy and satisfied with the students' performance and the use of technology in the Teaching – Learning – Evaluation process.

On 10th June Sr. Theresa joined our community. Sr. Ann from Delhi Province came to stay with us for some time as she could not go back to her province due to Lockdown.

Sr. Basilia the manager of the school hoisted the national Flag in the presence of Sisters.

Since Sr. Ursula 's health was deteriorating we informed her family members. So a number of her dear ones paid visit to her. Rev. Fr. Thomas Illimootil, a close friend of Sr. Ursula came along with our Parish Priest to see her. The former offered prayers for her and prepared her to meet her Heavenly Spouse. On 31 July, the feast of St. Ignatius, Sr. Ursula's nephew Fr. Joseph Parapuram came to see her and offered Holy Mass for us and thanked the community for the way we were taking care of her. From August 1 - 21 the community joined with the Shalom Television in '*Daniel Fasting Prayer*' to arrest the spread of Covid -19 Pandemic from the surface of the earth.

On 16 morning, after the Holy Mass we noticed Sr. Ursula's breathing difficulty. Immediately we called the Parish Priest. He came at once, prayed and prepared her to enter peacefully to her heavenly abode. At 9.00 a m in the presence of all the community members she breathed her last.

Due to Covid- 19 we were not permitted to keep her body in the convent for long. So the funeral service had to be conducted on the same day. Priests, Sisters, the relatives of many of our sisters, well wishers, people from our parish and neighbouring parishes paid homage to her.

Sr. Ursula's family members and sisters from Puthenvelikara, Thuruthipuram and Alakode joined us in the funeral service. We thank you dear sisters for your valuable prayers for Sr. Ursula. On 22 we had 'Mantra' (7 day prayer). About 40 people, including Sr. Ursula's dear ones, neighbours and sisters participated in it. After the church service all came to the convent for special prayers (Anitha) followed by breakfast.

From September 1 to 8, we observed 8 days fast / abstinence as was advised by our Major Arch Bishop Mar George Aalencherry to cease the spread of Covid -19 Pandemic from the universe.

The shooting for the 'Koodathai' short movie was done in our school campus.

On 5 September the school celebrated Teachers' Day in a unique way. Teachers, Parents and Students joined in the virtual prayer assembly and entertainment programme conducted by class X students under the guidance of the sisters.

We thank Sr. Nelcy for her magnanimous contribution towards the growth of the mission and in the community during the past one year and four months.

On 26 we commemorated the 41 day of demise of Sr. Ursula with Holy mass in our parish church and prayers at her grave.



Friends of Mary Ward-Education becomes a complete concept only when it creates a warm, sensitive, compassionate heart along with a strong intellect. It is with this ideal in mind the programme 'i- share' was initiated in our school. The 'i-share' programme helps to nurture and develop the habit of sharing with the less privileged and create awareness in social responsibilities among the children thus enabling the development of leadership qualities and true global citizenship.

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The 'i-share' fund was generated by the voluntary contribution of our students. Each student contributed Rs.1 per day and in each term the contributions were collected by the teachers or the students of JPIC and their animators. From the fund collected last year Rs.10,000/ was spent to feed-in loving memory of Sr. Ursula-143 inmates of Kunjachan Missionary Bhavan in Ramapuram who are mentally challenged and physically handicapped. Sisters, teachers, parents and ex-students went with JPIC students to Kunjachan Missionary Bhavan to serve them lunch. They were very happy and expressed their gratitude in their own way which indeed touched all of us.



On the same day a team of 'ishare 'and JPIC leaders along with Manager Sr. Basilia, Principal Sr. Suma, Sr. Berny, teacher representative and Parent representative donated Rs. 50,000/- from the 'i-share fund' to

our co-worker Mrs. Saly Kumaliyil for the purchase of a plot for the construction of a house Rs.7000/ to Mrs. Monica wife of Mr. Manichettan in favor of her medical treatment and Rs. 5000/- is given to Kumari Neha Augustine for her education purpose.



From the fund received from Sr.Ursula's benefactors, we gave Rs. 30,000/- for the education of the children of our supportive staff.

Due to Covid – 19 Pandemic and it's apparent lockdown we sacrificed everyday something or other and contributed Rs. 25,000/- to purchase a plot of land for the construction of a house for our domestic staff, Mrs. Saly Kumaliyil. Mr. Jebean Prem, a friend of Sr.Ursula donated Rs. 25,000/- to give it to Saly for the same purpose. We, Mary Ward's daughters, believe that we need to go a long way to reach out to many. We are certain that in the years to come we will do our best to spread happiness, joy and bring forth a radiant smile to as many as we can.

School activities: The new Academic session began with a lot of uncertainty. However, we began online classes for classes KG- to 10. It was a new learning for all of us and the staff. The willingness to learn and explore made all the difference. We arranged a webinar for the students of classes 9 & 10 on the theme "Study skills & Time management" and for the parents, "Creating a learning environment". It was appreciated by the parents and students.



It enabled the students to get into the seriousness of learning and preparing for their Board exams.

During the pandemic school was closed yet our teachers conducted farewell program for Srs. Deepti and Sanjana. They appreciated their dedicated service while they were part of school team. Sr. Sanjana left for Begur and Srs. Auxilia and Anjeli reached Mittapalli. Due to strict lockdown, the duties of our supportive staff were rearranged.

On 3 July the Feast of St. Thomas, at 6.30 am Sr. Deepti - as delegated by regional superior Sr. Daisy installed Sr. Auxilia as Animator of Mittapalli community. The choir led by Sr. Japa added to the solemnity of the High Holy Mass and festivities. The community gave a fitting farewell to Sr. Deepti before she



left for Begur from there to proceed to Puthenvelikara with Sr. Susan. The community had one day recollection on the topic "Community life".

Independence Day was celebrated on 15 August with Flag hoisting and prayer service and the school welcomed the correspondent Sr. Auxilia and Anjali. We had Holy Mass in the morning . With an organised recreation the day's celebration ended with a happy note. We had one-day recollection on the topic "The call of God" . We used the resource material sent by the COIN process group.

The community celebrated on 10 October Sr. Lawrentia 's feast with Holy Eucharist and festal meal followed by common recreation. Thanks be to God! This year we are blessed with sufficient rain. We are able to cultivate some crops in our field. We are already enjoying the home grown fruits and vegetables. Our campus also looks bright with colourful flowers and shelters for several beautiful birds. Due to strict lockdown, the duties of our supportive staff were rearranged. Some our sisters had their holidays during the pandemic .

The month of June was with uncertainties as the board examination was not over in the school. Due to Covid 19 we faced continuous postponement of examination dates for class X and XI. It was ordered that each school would be the exam centre as per norms and regulations. However, the exam was cancelled on 15 June, and the promotion solely depended on marks scored in 1 and 2 term and attendance along with the required documents. The government declared all promotion for the students up to class 9. Sisters and a few teachers went to Mathur and submitted marks, report cards and log books of the students of Classes 10 and 11. In the board examination Harish M topped class XII, Nikhil Ramsamy scored highest in class XI and P.U.Varsaa

and Jagan Singh are toppers in Std X. We started with the Online class from 8 June and for board exam students after their results in July.

St. Mary's Convent, Mulund

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Amidst lockdown we too were 'off'; and went online for everything. As many of us actually became part of 'Go Digital'. As it is said that Learning is a womb to tomb process and so all of us: sisters, teachers, parents and the students were trained for online schooling by our computer teachers. Our students did very well. We celebrated the feast of St Ignatius of Loyola. We prepared ourselves spiritually for the same and turned the next page of our calendar.

The month of August kept us all active as the community took active part in attending webinars, meetings, celebrations and programmes online. We attended webinar on "Emotional Well-being" by Sr. Prisca CJ and Mary Ward by Sr. Carmel IBVM. We bid farewell to Sr. Divya, who was missioned to Alakode and at the same time we got the news that Sr. Divya's father was sick, so she flew to see her father. Our Students both from Primary and secondary participated in interschool competitions at Seven Isles International School and

bagged a few prizes. Vianney Sunday was yet another exciting programme. With the combined efforts of Parish council and youth of our parish, the online programme came out to be an excellent one. Our community sang a wishing song which was well appreciated by our parish priest. Freedom festival was celebrated online with prayer service and programmes.



Sr. Edwina hoisted the national Flag in the presence of Sisters, few teachers and co-workers. We had online mass to mark the Assumption and Independence.

Our Parish celebrated the feast of St. Pius x, our Patron Saint. Three days' preparations went prior to that. Online mass and Reflection talks by notable speakers were telecasted on YouTube which dealt with various themes applicable to present situation. This spiritual journey was appreciated by the Parishners. The climax was online **'Pius Fiesta 2020'** which was filled with games, fun and surprises. It was an excellent evening amidst lockdown and Pandemic Trauma. The community celebrated Sr. Seema's birthday with community mass and festal meal.

Corona managed to close down the schools but not Teaching and learning. Our teachers had been learning and teaching online. To appreciate their hard work on the occasion of teachers' day, Sr. Edwina arranged for a prayer service and a short entertainment programme, with a message online. The preparations of nine days for the feast of Nativity of our Blessed mother were well arranged by our parish. We celebrated it as St. Mary's day. To mark this auspicious occasion both Primary and Secondary sections put up prayer services which Sr. Christine concluded with a message.

Due to lockdown our KG admission process was incomplete for both SSC and ICSE (first batch of 83 students). However Parents were called in groups to complete the formalities. Distribution of rice and pulses was carried out in the school to students of std 5-8 as per Govt. Mid Day Meal Scheme. Surplus rice and pulses were then distributed to all the other students too.

To cope up with the present Covid times, the school has arranged counselling sessions for students of standard VII to X - four sessions for each std. through out the academic year 2020-21 including two sessions for parents of these students with the help of Prafulta Counselling Centre an NGO run by Don Bosco, Matunga. Already one session for parents and two for students have been completed.

In the beginning of October we witnessed **Exodus** experience with sisters coming in and going out. Srs. Linda and Jyotsana spent a day with us before they left for Bangalore on 3^{rd} morning. Our Contractor, Mr.Thomas was generous enough to take them to Bangalore in his car

SMAART, our SMC Alumnae Association was very active during the Corona Pandemic season:- There are about 1800 resident doctors and healthcare workers in the Muncipal hospitals in Mumbai. One of them, Dr.Ashima, is one of our former students. Through her we came to know the pitiable condition of the doctors who missed their mid-day meals as they were very busy at that time, with the Corona patients.

she arranged for snack boxes for them so that they could eat when they could be free. SMAART members have joined Dr. Ashima in her effort to help the doctors, by shouldering part of the expenses incurred by supplying snack boxes to the doctors. This will continue until the epidemic is brought under control.

St. Mary's Convent, Alakode

Our Parish Church re-opened on 20 June after three months' gap and we were very happy to attend Holy Mass daily, once again in the church. After seven years of zealous and committed service, Rev. Fr. Siby Anakallil, the Vicar of our parish church, bid goodbye to us on 27 June. He was instrumental in constructing a beautiful church at Alakode. On the same day, the parishioners welcomed the newly appointed parish priest Rev. Fr. Emmanuel Attel and the assistant parish priest.

We had twin feast day celebration of Srs. Gladys and Thomasina on 2 July . Rev. Fr. Johnson offered Holy Mass for their intentions. The fathers joined us for the feast day dinner, during which we welcomed them. In spite of the lock down in our area, we managed to plant rubber saplings in our land on 27 July.

Mr. Kuttichen, Sr. Basilia's brother was a great support and he gives us timely advice to take care of the saplings.

Our senior citizens, Srs. Esther, Imma and Fransica were brought to our community by Srs. Georgia and Amala on 2 August. Their presence made our community more joyful and we had a lot of fun and laughter. They remained healthy and happy here. Our Parish Priest was generous enough to offer Holy Mass daily in our chapel during their stay here. Srs. Anisha and Sherly reached them to their respective communities on 25 September. On their return on 26 Srs. Divya and Nelcy, the new members our community joined from Angamali and the community happily welcomed them.

We celebrated Onam with a variety of dishes. The three priests from our parish too joined us for the Onam sadhya. The feast of St. Theresa of child Jesus, the patron saint of Sr. Sherly was celebrated on the 1 October. We had a meaningful Holy Eucharist offered by our Parish Priest in our chapel and thereafter a delicious meal was served.

We began the new academic year on 1 June 2020, imploring God's blessing up on the school through an online prayer service. During the first week of June, online PTA meetings were organized for all classes by Sr. Sherly to convince the parents about the necessity of starting online classes due to Covid 19 pandemic. By 6 June we started regular classes for the students of LKG to XII using Microsoft Teams online platform. The teachers, parents and the students are very co-operative and our endeavour to reach out to the students to

impart knowledge during the lock down has been effective .We have also integrated Art, PT and Moral Science classes along with other subjects. We conduct Unit Tests and Terminal Examinations with the help of Google forms and Microsoft Forms 365. The class teachers organize online classes. Online PTA meetings are held after the Unit Tests and Terminal Examinations to get feedback from the parents.

We conducted various online competitions such as Poster Making for Higher Secondary, Patiotic song album making for the High school students T-shirt painting for the UP section, Speech and Action song for primary section . As a part of FIT INDIA



programme, for LKG and UKG Fancy Dress competition was held .It was observed



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from 3 September to 2 October as Freedom Run Week. The participants had to run 2km. every day. 850 students participated from



our school and they were given e-certificates. As a part of Mental Health Week observation all the students from classes 10, 11 & 12 participated in poster making competition on mental health.



Celebrations and observation of special days through Microsoft Teams ensured complete participation of the students and cheered them up. Independence Day and Onam were celebrated class wise under the guidance of the class teachers. Students

performed various cultural items like songs, dances, fancy dress etc. from their homes which were watched by the students and parents from their homes. During

the Onam celebration "Maveli" visited every class with the principal and it was indeed a pleasant surprise for the whole school. Teachers' Day was celebrated by the students on Google Meet to wish and thank their teachers in a fitting manner. The ex-students too made it a point to appreciate their teachers on the occasion.

We paid homage to Mahatma Gandhi on 2 October through video presentations by KG, Primary and High school sections which were sent to class whatsapp groups.

This year our school was a centre for NEET examination and we conducted it very successfully. It was indeed a very tedious task as it





was the first time we conducted NEET in our school. It had to be conducted following Covid 19 protocol.



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10.10.2020 turned out to be one of the saddest days for all of us at St. Mary's Alakode as our dear loving student JOZEN JIMMI JOSE of class 8B succumbed to death due to Covid 19. CBSE has introduced Art Integrated Learning from classes 1 to 12 as one of the subject enrichment activities. The students are fully engaged in preparing art integrated projects under the guidance of their teachers.

At the end, on 25 September Srs. Anisha and Sherly accompanied them and they reached around 2.0 clock. Sr. Imma is very grateful to Sr. Anisha and community for the care and concern shown to them. They enjoyed their stay in Alakode.

In spite of the lock down and all the inconveniences attached to the corona virus we are all keeping well. Let us all pray that this virus be wiped out of the earth so that we can all live in peace and freedom once again.
